A Family Nurse Practitioner is an advanced practice nurse with a master's degree in nursing who is board-certified by a national credentialing center. A Nurse Practitioner provides preventive medicine through education and wellness services. Nurse Practitioners may perform physical examinations and sick visits, and write prescriptions. In addition, they treat patients using a holistic approach, caring for both their physical and mental wellness. Please remember that the Family Nurse Practitioner will **NOT** replace your regular doctor (Primary Care Physician).
